

NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

'Romanian Language' is a *peer review* journal that publishes novel and innovative articles in the field of linguistics in Romanian or in English, French, German, Italian and Spanish.

Texts will be sent in electronic format (Word, with an rtf or doc extension) and/or on paper. Each article received at the editorial office will be read by two reviewers, appointed by the Editorial Board. Authors whose articles have been reviewed favorably are asked to take notice of the observations made by reviewers with a view to publication. The Editorial Board will provide the authors with information regarding the results of the evaluation of their articles not later than three months from receiving the manuscript.

Articles will be typed according to MLA instructions, 5th or 6th edition, as follows:

Length of articles: A maximum of 10 pages (2,000 characters), including notes, references and abstract.

Font: Times New Roman, 12

Spacing: 1.5 lines

Page numbering: Top of the page, right

Running title: A maximum of 50 characters (including spaces separating words), no abbreviations

Title: Centre, capital letters

Author name: Above the title, left side, in small capital letters (with the exception of initial letters)

Five keywords in Romanian and their translation in English or French, according to the model:

Cuvinte cheie: lingvistică, pragmatică, analiza discursului, manuale, limba franceză

Keywords: linguistics, pragmatics, discourse analysis, textbooks, French language

Mots-clés: linguistique, pragmatique, l'analyse du discours, manuels, la langue française

Paragraphs will be marked by 5 spaces (1 Tab)

Short quotations (1-4 lines) are inserted between quotation marks and are included in the body of the article.

Quotation marks will be marked according to the rules of the language the article is written in

Quotations longer than 1-4 lines will be typed centrally (1 cm from the rest of the text) and will not be inserted between quotation marks.

Notes will be typed with the Times New Roman 10 font and inserted at the bottom of the page

Reference to works mentioned or quoted in the text may be made in two manners: a. by using footnotes, and in this case the name of the publishing house is not to be mentioned among the information regarding the book and b. by using name abbreviations that are explained at the end of the article (for instance: Nestorescu, *Glosar* (=Nestorescu, *Glossary*) – where the name abbreviations stand for: Virgil Nestorescu, *Glosar dialectal. Români timoceni din Bulgaria*, în vol. *Floarea darurilor. In memoriam Ion Gheție*, București 2002) (= *Dialectal Glossary. Timocean Romanians in Bulgaria*, in the volume entitled *Blossom of Benefactions. In Memory of Ion Gheție*, Bucharest, 2002).

If reference is made to books published abroad, the name of the city remains as it appears on the title page, for example: London, not „Londra,” The Hague, not „Haga.“

Abstract: Articles will be followed by an abstract written in English or French.

Articles written in a foreign language will be followed by an abstract in Romanian and by an abstract in English or French. The abstract will be preceded by the title of the article, followed by the word 'abstract' inserted between brackets – in the same language as the text of the abstract.

Affiliation: At the end of the article, the author will specify his/her institutional affiliation, mail address and e-mail address.
